



CINNAMON ROLL COOKIES

Yields: 3 dz. Prep Time: 30 mins Total Time
3 hrs. 15 mins



Ingredients

For the cookies:

- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 4 oz. cream cheese, room temperature
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg yolk, room temperature
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 3 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/4 tsp. kosher salt

For the filling:

- 3/4 cup light brown sugar, packed
- 6 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 1 Tbsp. ground cinnamon
- 6 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted

For the glaze:

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
- 1/2 tsp. maple extract
- 1 to 2 tablespoons warm water



Directions

1. For the cookies: In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, combine butter, cream cheese, and sugar. Beat on medium speed for 2 to 3 minutes, or until light and fluffy. Add the egg yolk and the vanilla, then mix on low until fully combined, scraping the bottom and sides of the bowl as needed.

2.In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, cornstarch, baking powder, and salt. Gradually add the flour mixture to the butter mixture and mix on low speed until fully combined.

3.Remove the dough to a sheet of parchment paper and press the dough into a 5-inch square. Place another sheet of parchment paper over the square and use a rolling pin to roll the dough into a 14-by-10-inch rectangle. Chill the dough in the refrigerator until firm, 15 to 20 minutes.

4.For the filling: In a small bowl, stir together the brown sugar, flour, and cinnamon. Pour in the melted butter, stirring until the butter is evenly distributed and the mixture forms a paste.

5.Remove the dough from the refrigerator and remove the top piece of parchment paper. Using a small spatula, carefully dollop the filling all over the dough. Gently spread the filling into an even layer, reaching the edges of the dough as best you can.



6. Working slowly, carefully roll the dough from the long side into a tight log, removing the bottom layer of parchment as you roll. Carefully wrap the log in plastic wrap and chill in the refrigerator for at least 2 hours or overnight.

7. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Line 1 baking sheet with parchment paper.

8. Remove the dough from the refrigerator and, using a sharp knife, slice into ½-inch-thick rounds. Place the cookies 2 inches apart on the prepared baking sheet. Rewrap and refrigerate the remaining cookie dough until ready to slice and bake.


9 .Bake until lightly browned, 10 to 12 minutes. Let the cookies cool on the baking sheet for about 5 minutes. Transfer them to a wire rack to cool completely. Repeat with the remaining cookies.

10. For the glaze: In a medium bowl, combine the powdered sugar, melted butter, and maple extract. Add the warm water, 1 teaspoon at a time, until the icing falls off the whisk in a fluid stream and the fallen ribbon of icing holds its shape for only a few seconds before sinking back into the bowl of icing.

11. Use a spoon to drizzle the glaze onto the cookies, or for a more even look, use a zip-top bag: Spoon the glaze into the bag and snip 1/8 inch off the end. Allow to set for 15 minutes.

12. Store the cookies in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 1 week.




Building Permits & Related Information

In most cases, City permits are required to ensure compliance with building codes, property line setbacks, zoning regulations, and other state and local requirements. Please consider the following information BEFORE beginning any projects:

- M Some common projects requiring permits include asphalt or concrete work, structure
 alterations and additions, new or replacement fencing, swimming pools, solar panels
 porches, patios and decks, roof repairs or replacement, storage sheds, construction of
 any new structure, and demolition of any existing structure. Always verify if your
 project requires a permit prior to beginning any work by contacting City Hall.
- Illinois law requires anyone contracting for roof repair or replacement work to be licensed by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation. City permit petitions require contractors to provide necessary licensing information to help protect businesses, homeowners, and neighbors.
- Some projects may require a variance or special use permit to be compliant with the City
 Code. After a public hearing with the Planning and Zoning Board, a recommendation is
 submitted to the Maroa City Council for consideration and authorization by ordinance. If
 the variance or special use is approved, permits can be issued. Due to state regulations
 regarding publication of notice, this process generally takes 30 to 60 days to complete.
- Many projects require property line markers to be located and exposed for setback verification. If property line markers cannot be located, you must have the parcel surveyed prior to receiving a permit.
- Fillable PDF petitions for permits are available at maroaillinois.gov and paper copies are
 available at City Hall. The petition for a permit must be completed in entirety (including
 all requested information) and submitted to City Hall for verification and approval. A
 certificate will only be issued after the petition is approved and associated fees are paid.
 Work on the project can only begin once a certificate is issued and posted.
- You are required by state law to contact J.U.L.I.E (dial 811) for locating services before
 proceeding with any excavation. This includes hand digging at any depth. The
 individual performing the digging MUST be the one to submit a J.U.L.I.E ticket.
- Failure to obtain a building permit prior to work being performed will result in doubled fees, processing delays, and possible fines.
