

Simply Pumpkin Pancakes

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 15 mins

Total Time: 25 mins

Servings: 4 Yield: 8 pumpkin pancakes

Ingredients

1 ¼ cups all-purpose flour

¼ cup white sugar

- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 cup milk
- ½ cup pumpkin puree
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil

Directions

- 1. Sift flour, sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, and nutmeg together in a bowl.
- 2. Whisk milk, pumpkin, egg, and oil together in a bowl. Pour milk mixture into flour mixture and stir until just moistened. The batter will be slightly lumpy.
- 3. Heat a lightly oiled griddle over medium-high heat to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Drop batter by large spoonful's onto the griddle and cook until bubbles

form and the edges are dry, 1 to 3 minutes. Flip and cook until browned on the other side, about 1 minute more. Repeat with remaining batter.









§ 195-1 Burning garbage and wastes.

<u>A.</u>

The open burning of commercial, agricultural and domicile waste within the City limits of the City of Maroa is prohibited. "Domicile waste" is defined as any refuse generated on residential property as a result of domiciliary activities.



<u>B.</u>

It shall be unlawful to burn any landscape waste within the City limits except between sunrise and sunset on Monday through Saturday, and from 12:00 noon on Sunday to sunset, and only upon the premises where it is produced. "Landscape waste" means all accumulations of grass or shrubbery cuttings, leaves and other materials accumulating as a result of the care of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees. § 195-2 **Permissible burning.**

Not withstanding the provisions of this chapter, it shall not be prohibited to openly burn landscape waste from sunset to sunrise on each

day of the week, provided that the burning of such landscape waste is performed solely for recreational purposes and not for waste disposal purposes. Any such recreational burning of landscape waste will only be permitted where such activity is supervised by a person 18 years of age or older.





BUILDING PERMITS AND RELATED INFORMATION

Fair weather always brings increased construction and renovation activity throughout the community. In most cases, City permits are required to ensure compliance with building codes, property line setbacks, zoning regulations, and other state and local requirements. Please consider the following information **BEFORE** beginning any projects:

You are required by state law to contact J.U.L.I.E (**dial 811**) for locating services before proceeding with any excavation. This includes hand digging at any depth.

Many projects require property line markers to be located and exposed for setback verification. If property line markers cannot be located, you must have the parcel surveyed prior to receiving a permit.

Fillable PDF petitions for permits are available at maroaillinois.gov and paper copies are available at City Hall. The petition for a permit must be completed in entirety (including all requested information) and submitted to City Hall for verification and approval. A certificate will only be issued after the petition is approved and associated fees are paid. Work on the project can only begin once a certificate is issued and posted.

Some projects may require a variance to be compliant with the City Code. After a public hearing with the Planning and Zoning Board, a recommendation is submitted to the Maroa City Council for consideration and authorization by ordinance. If the variance is approved, permits can be Issued. Due to state regulations regarding publication of notice, this process generally takes 30 to 60 days to complete.

BUILDING PERMITS AND RELATED INFORMATION

Some common projects requiring permits include asphalt or concrete work, structure alterations and additions, new or replacement fencing, swimming pools, solar panels, porches, patios and decks, roof repairs or replacement, storage sheds, construction of any new structure, and demolition of any existing structure. Always verify if your project requires a permit prior to beginning any work by contacting City Hall.

Failure to obtain a building permit prior to work being performed will result in doubled fees, processing delays, and possible fines.

SPECIAL NOTICE: Hail damage associated with recent severe weather in the area has led to an increase in door-to-door solicitation of roofing work. Be advised, **Illinois law requires anyone contracting for roof repair or replacement work to be licensed by the Illi-**
